**Subject:- Grant of conditional permission to Government Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Raje Raghuj Nahgar, Sakkardara Square, Umrer Road-440024, Nagpur Maharashtra (Inst. Id- AYU0171) regarding permission for intake capacity of 100 seats (125 seats including EWS) of UG (BAMS) course and 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in 10 PG course –(i) Kayachikitsa-06 seats (08 seats including EWS) (ii) Rasa Shastra and Bhaisajya Kalpana –06 seats (08 seats including EWS) (iii) Ayurveda Samhita and Siddhant –06 seats (including 07 seats) (iv) Rachna Sharir – 06 seats (08 seats including EWS) (v) Kriya Sharir – 06 seats (07 seats including EWS) (vi) Swasthavritta –06 seats (08 seats including EWS) (vii) Rog Nidan – 06 seats (07 seats including EWS) (viii) Shalaky Tantra – 06 seats (07 seats including EWS) (ix) Shalaya Tantra – 06 seats (08 seats including EWS) (x) Agad Tantra-06 seats (07 seats including EWS) under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23 and relevant regulations thereunder in respect of appeal dated 21.10.2022 and 28.10.2022- regarding.**

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

1. This is with reference to the first appeal filed by Vd. K. Rajeshwar Reddy, Director of AYUSH, Govt. of Maharashtra vide letter ref. no. DAMS/NCISM/GAC/Appeal/2022/Ayu-2/11782 dated **21.10.2022** and letter ref. no. .DAMS/NCISM/GAC/Appeal/2022/Ayu-2/12229 dated 28.10.2022 to the commission in respect of denial of conditional permission issued to the **Government colleges of Maharashtra namely Government Ayurved College, Nanded-431601, Vazirabad, Maharashtra (Inst. Id- AYU0185), Government Ayurved College, Tulajur Road-413501, Osmanabad, Maharashtra (Inst. Id- AYU0154), Government Ayurved College & Hospital, 26/1, Shri Gulabrao Deokar Engineering Campus, Mohadi, Shirsol Road-425002, Jalgaon Maharashtra (Inst. Id- AYU0592), R.A Podar Ayurved Medical College, Dr.Ananie Bezant Road, Worli- 400018, Mumbai, Maharashtra (Inst. ID- AYU0164), Government Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Raje Raghuj Nahgar, Sakkardara Square, Umrer Road-440024, Nagpur Maharashtra (Inst. Id- AYU0171) for conducting UG and PG courses as the case may be due to not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for post-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder due to non availability of teaching, non-teaching staff, hospital staff and other shortcoming as mentioned in denial orders dated 19.10.2022.**
2. Thereafter the said appeal was placed before the Chairman, NCISM and Chairman NCISM constituted a Hearing Committee and provided an opportunity of hearing to the college. Accordingly, the letter was sent to The **The Director**, Directorate of AYUSH, Government of Maharashtra vide commission letter no. **Ref. No. NCISM/Comm./Appeal/(2022-23) dated 26.10.2022** to appear before the designated hearing committee as constituted by the Chairman, NCISM on **01.11.2022** in respect of appeal filed under section 10(1)(g) and section 24(3) of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020 and to produce all relevant valid documents/records/ proof to substantiate the claims and make written submission and submit an authenticated copy of evidence/verifications to commission with shortcoming wise clarifications mentioned in the denial orders dated 19.10.2022 passed by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM. The proceedings of appeal were held virtually on **01.11.2022 at 12:00 PM** and on behalf of all Government colleges of Maharashtra, Vd. K. Rajeshwar Reddy, Director of AYUSH, Govt. of Maharashtra attended the hearing .
3. The hearing committee sought clarification from the representatives of Maharashtra Government regarding shortcomings mentioned in the denial orders dated 19.10.2022 passed by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM, which is as under:-

**b. Availability of Total Higher Faculty after considering the submission of the college is 53.63 % which is not fulfilling the Minimum criteria of 80% as required in Scheduled V of MSR 2016.**

**c. Availability of Hospital Staff is 78.43% which is not fulfilling the minimum criteria of 80% as required in Schedule IV of MSR, 2016.**

**d. Availability of Non-Teaching Staff is 77.5% which is not fulfilling the minimum criteria of 80% as required in Schedule VI of MSR, 2016.**

**e. College website is not updated as required in Regulation 9 (2) of MSR, 2016.**

**f. There is deficiency of 12 beds against the minimum requirement as mentioned in Regulation 7 (2) of MSR, 2016.**

mentioned by the respective National Commission for Indian System of Medicine shall be fulfilled by dt. 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2022.

I also submit that under my Directorate of Ayush Maharashtra State, Mumbai we are running five Government Ayurveda Colleges and attached Government Ayurveda Hospitals at Mumbai, Nagpur, Nanded, Osmanabad & Jalgoan.

As on today in above mentioned Government Ayurveda Colleges we are having vacancy of teaching posts as follows.

I promise you the post by nomination will be filled up through Maharashtra Public Service Commission till 31.12.2022. I also submit that we have submitted promotion post proposals to the Government and upto 31.12.2022 the promotion will be made.

I also submit that the respective Deans of all Government Ayurveda Colleges started the procedure of contractual appointments. Also the Government resolution for increase in payment of Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor will be received within 8 days from the Government.

I also submit that under my Directorate the following group C and group D vacancy current position is as follows.

I submit that the group C posts of Nominations will be filled up in due course through committee as per Government resolution dt. 23.06.2022 and also as per Government resolution dt. 04.05.2022 that Deans of the said colleges are following procedure to fill up the group D post at respective college level. The procedure will be completed up to 31.12.2022.

As per your letter the Dean, R.A. Podar (Ayu.) Medical College, Mumbai submitted the compliance of shortcomings vide letter dt. 27.10.2022 and said letter is attached.

We also submit that in this regard, a Notarized Affidavit on Rs. 100/- stamp paper regarding fulfilment of shortcomings pointed out in above mentioned all the Government Ayurveda Colleges of Maharashtra was submitted as per Letter No. DAMS/NCISM/GAC/Deficiencies-Affidevit/2022/Ay-3/1129-34, Dt. 07.10.2022.

I, Director AYUSH, State of Maharashtra hereby appealing on behalf of above mentioned five Government Ayurveda Colleges & its attached Hospitals that above mentioned shortcomings shall be fulfilled by dt. 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2022.

It is earnestly requested that in the interest of the academic benefit of meritorious students desirous to pursue UG (MD/MS) courses in the State, kindly reconsider the denial of conditional permission for admission in UG and PG course in above mentioned all Government Ayurveda colleges in the academic year 2022-23.

It is requested that in above mentioned all Government Ayurveda Colleges and Hospitals in the State may kindly be granted permission for admission in UG and PG course in academic year 2022-2023.

response of the same Dr. V. K. Rajeshwar Reddy assured the committee that all the shortcomings mentioned will be completed before 31<sup>st</sup> December 2022.

- Further, he told Departmental promotion is going to fulfill the requirement in all the Government Ayurveda colleges of Maharashtra.
- He also told that G.R. will be published in two days regarding appointment and increasing salary from 80K, 90K and 1 Lakh 3 thousand and for Lecturer, Reader and Professor respectively which is submitted after the hearing along with the submission.
- Committee asked to submit undertaking regarding their assurance of fulfilling faculty signed by secretary and director of Ayush Maharashtra. And also asked to send advertisement copy of vacancy call form and G.R. about salary.
- Appellant requested to give all UG and PG seats to the mentioned colleges as they are going to fulfill all the vacancies and will comply all shortcomings before 31<sup>st</sup> December 2022.
- Committee received the submission after hearing along with undertaking, copy of G.R. and copy of the advertisement.

4. The submission made by the Govt. of Maharashtra was placed before the designated hearing committee and hearing committee sought clarification regarding the shortcomings mentioned in the denial orders dated 19.10.2022 and also asked for the compliance of Shortcomings and asked the representatives to submit the affidavit regarding their assurance in respect of fulfillment of all requirement as mentioned in the denial orders.
5. In response of the same, Vd. K. Rajeshwar Reddy, Director of AYUSH, Government of Maharashtra vide letter no. DAMS/NCISM/GAC/Deficiencies-Undertaking/2022/Ay-2/12714 dated 10.11.2022 submitted the affidavit given by the Secretary, Medical Education and Drug Department, Mantralaya, Mumbai- 4400032 vide Ref No. 28AA 478202 dated 15.11.2022 and with the affirmation that all vacancies of Non-Availability of Teaching, Non-Teaching, Hospital staff shall be fulfilled by dated 31.12.2022.

...; in view of the affidavit submitted by the Director of AYUSH, Government of Maharashtra vide Ref No. 28AA 478202 dated 11.11.2022, the Chairman, NCISM directed the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM vide no. NCISM/Comm./Appeal/(2022-23) dated 15.11.2022 to grant conditional permission to **Government Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Raje Raghuj Nahgar, Sakkardara Square, Umrer Road-440024, Nagpur Maharashtra (Inst. Id-AYU0171)** under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23.

7. Therefore, it has been decided by the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM to issue conditional permission to **Government Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Raje Raghuj Nahgar, Sakkardara Square, Umrer Road-440024, Nagpur Maharashtra (Inst. Id-AYU0171)** regarding permission for intake capacity of 100 seats (125 seats including EWS) of UG (BAMS) course and 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in 10 PG course –(i) Kayachikitsa-06 seats (08 seats including EWS) (ii) Rasa Shastra and Bhaishajya Kalpana –06 seats (08 seats including EWS) (iii) Ayurveda Samhita and Siddhant –06 seats (including 07 seats) (iv) Rachna Sharir – 06 seats (08 seats including EWS) (v) Kriya Sharir – 06 seats (07 seats including EWS) (vi) Swasthavritta -06 seats (08 seats including EWS) (vii) Rog Nidan – 06 seats (07 seats including EWS) (viii) Shalaky Tantra – 06 seats (07 seats including EWS) (ix) Shalaya Tantra – 06 seats (08 seats including EWS) (x) Agad Tantra-06 seats (07 seats including EWS) under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23 on the basis of undertaking submitted vide letter no.DAMS/NCISM/GAC/Defficineies-Undertaking/2022/AY-2/12714 dated 10.11.2022 by the Director of AYUSH, Government of Maharashtra and vide letter no. AYUSH/1122/C.R.115/Ayu-I dated 09.11.2022 by the Secretary, Medical Education and Drug Department, Mantralaya, Mumbai subject to following condition:-

(i) It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 seats (125 seats including EWS) and 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in 10 PG course shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2022-23 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.

9. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

10. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2022 **and send a compliance report to get permission for the session 2023-24:**

- I. all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
- II. all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
- III. all the requirements of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for post-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016
- IV. all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in to; and

11. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission from the academic session 2023-24.
